Itinerary

DAY 01

MEXICO CITY ARRIVAL

Meet & Greet at Mexico City International Airport and transfer to the hotel in Mexico City. Accommodation at Royal Reforma Hotel 4* – Standard Room – Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 02

MEXICO CITY (IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF FRIDA KAHLO)

Breakfast at Hotel. Transfer to Coyoacán, one of the oldest and most emblematic neighborhoods of Mexico City, renowned for its rich cultural heritage, bohemian atmosphere, and deeply rooted traditions. Visit the iconic Casa Azul, now a museum, where Frida Kahlo was born and lived, and which, in celebration of the season, features an impressive altar dedicated to the artist, reflecting the profound connection between her legacy and the traditions of the Day of the Dead. Continuation to the Anahuacalli Museum, a unique structure conceived by Diego Rivera, notable for its volcanic stone architecture and home to an invaluable collection of pre-Hispanic art, as well as traditional altars that offer insight into the indigenous worldview surrounding life and death. Lunch at a local restaurant in Coyoacán (drinks not included), with time to enjoy traditional cuisine in a historic setting. In the afternoon, walking tour of Mexico City's Historic Center, including the Zócalo and the Metropolitan Cathedral, where early installations, decorations, and the festive atmosphere of the Day of the Dead can be appreciated, transforming the heart of the city into a vibrant stage of color, symbolism, and tradition. Accommodation at Royal Reforma Hotel 4* – Standard Room – Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 03

MEXICO CITY → QUERETARO (217 KM)

Breakfast at Hotel. At 8:00 a.m., departure to Querétaro, a splendid colonial city declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, renowned for its well-preserved architecture and its historical significance in the formation of Mexico. Upon arrival, panoramic tour of the city's main attractions, including the impressive Aqueduct, one of its most iconic landmarks; the Mirador, offering privileged views of the historic center; Independence Square; the Casa de la Corregidora, a symbol of the independence movement; and the historic Theater of the Republic, the setting for key national events. The visit is completed with the elegant Baroque churches of Santa Clara and San Agustín, remarkable examples of New Spanish sacred art. Lunch at a local restaurant (drinks not included), where regional cuisine can be enjoyed. Accommodation at Fairfield by Marriott Inn & Suites Queretaro Juriquilla Hotel 4* – Standard Room – Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 04

QUERETARO → SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE (92 KM).

Breakfast at Hotel. Departure to San Miguel de Allende (approximately 1.5 hours), one of Mexico's most emblematic colonial cities, designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Upon arrival, tour of its historic center, distinguished by its Baroque architecture and cobblestone streets, which during this season are transformed into a festive setting of great visual and cultural richness. Participation in the renowned Festival de la Calaca, one of the country's most representative Day of the Dead celebrations, featuring outstanding artistic installations, contemporary cultural expressions, and colorful Catrina parades that fill the city with color and symbolism. Free time to enjoy the vibrant atmosphere, explore the artisan markets, and appreciate local talent in a unique environment that blends tradition, art, and creativity. Accommodation at Misión San Miguel de Allende Hotel 4* - Standard Room - Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 05

SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE → GUANAJUATO → GUADALAJARA (351 KM).

Breakfast at Hotel. Departure in the morning to Guanajuato, a colonial city of great historical and cultural value, declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Upon arrival, a brief panoramic tour of its main landmarks: the Monument to El Pípila, offering spectacular views of the city; the iconic Juárez Theater, a jewel of Porfirian architecture; and the famous Alley of the Kiss, a symbol of local folklore and legends. Continuation of the journey to Guadalajara, capital of the state of Jalisco. Arrival in the early afternoon to witness the Grand Day of the Dead Parade, one of the most outstanding events of the celebration, featuring spectacular floats, masks, and artistic performances that fill the streets with color, tradition, and contemporary cultural expression. Accommodation at voco Guadalajara Neruda by IHG Hotel 4* - Standard Room - Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 06

GUADALAJARA (TEQUILA + TLAQUEPAQUE).

Breakfast at Hotel. Visit to Guadalajara's historic center, where its main architectural and cultural landmarks can be appreciated, reflecting the identity of Jalisco. This is followed by an excursion to the "Pueblo Mágico" of Tequila to visit a traditional distillery and learn in detail about the tequila production process, Mexico's iconic spirit, from agave cultivation to distillation and aging. Return to Tlaquepaque, one of the most representative districts of Mexican art and tradition, to experience the climax of the Day of the Dead celebrations. Walk among monumental altars, art galleries, and craft shops, accompanied by the unmistakable sound of mariachi music at the traditional Parián, in a festive atmosphere that blends culture, folklore, and living tradition. Accommodation at voco Guadalajara Neruda by IHG Hotel 4* - Standard Room - Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 07

GUADALAJARA → PATZCUARO → MORELIA (384 KM).

Breakfast at Hotel. Departure to Pátzcuaro, considered the heart of Michoacán tradition and one of Mexico's most authentic destinations for the Day of the Dead celebration. Upon arrival, visit to the Basilica of Our Lady of Health, an important spiritual center of the region; the iconic House of the Eleven Courtyards, now a cultural and artisan space; and the city's main monumental squares, where history, architecture, and daily life intertwine in a deeply traditional atmosphere. In the afternoon, when the light and ambiance take on a particularly evocative and ceremonial character, continuation of the journey to Morelia, the state capital, for accommodation and rest. Accommodation at Horizon and Convention Center Hotel 4* - Standard Room - Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 08

MORELIA → MEXICO CITY (311 KM).

Breakfast at Hotel. Guided visit of Morelia, an elegant colonial city declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site, renowned for the harmony of its pink quarry stone architecture and its remarkable historical legacy. The tour includes the impressive Cathedral, a jewel of New Spanish Baroque; the Clavijero Palace, an outstanding example of civil architecture and a present-day cultural center; and the monumental Aqueduct, one of the city's most iconic landmarks. The walk concludes at the romantic Callejón del Romance, a symbolic space rich in history and tradition. Lunch at a local restaurant (drinks not included) to sample regional cuisine. In the afternoon, return to Mexico City. Accommodation at Royal Reforma Hotel 4* - Standard Room - Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 09

MEXICO CITY → MIXQUIC → MEXICO CITY.

Breakfast at Hotel. Departure to Mixquic, a picturesque town with deep pre-Hispanic and colonial roots, famous for preserving in an authentic way the funerary rituals associated with the Day of the Dead. Upon arrival, visit the Temple of San Andrés Apóstol and the local cemetery, the main setting of the traditional Alumbrada, where the legacy of this ancestral celebration can be appreciated along candlelit paths, marigold flowers, and altars carefully arranged in honor of the deceased. Afterwards, a stroll through the town to discover its community murals, an expression of Mixquic's collective identity and memory. Free time to sample typical seasonal specialties, such as traditional pan de muerto and local tamales, before the return. Accommodation at Royal Reforma Hotel 4* - Standard Room - Bed & Breakfast Plan.

DAY 10

MEXICO CITY → AIRPORT.

Breakfast at Hotel. At the scheduled time, transfer to Mexico City Airport to take the return flight home (flight not included).
